

Join The Great Courses Journeys in southern Germany, a region where history and tradition intersect at every turn. Begin in Munich, where royal palaces stand as a testament to the artistic and political ambitions of former dynasties and traditional beer gardens offer an entertaining example of the historical significance of communal dining and brewing culture in German society.

Travel to Haldenwang for the rare opportunity to witness the annual *Viehscheid*, or cow train, that marks the return of cattle from alpine pastures with lively music, dancing, and regional cuisine. Continue to Nuremberg, where both castles and beer have roots that date back to the Middle Ages, and visit Rothenburg ob der Tauber, one of Germany's most well-preserved medieval towns and home to Franconian wines renowned for their distinct terroir. Conclude your journey in the university town of Heidelberg, where the evocative ruins of Heidelberg Castle and monastic winemaking traditions of Eberbach Monastery showcase how culture is not only preserved in sites and monuments, but also in the languages, traditions, and artisanal practices that endure throughout the ages.

Dr. Larissa 'Kat' Tracy (May 2026) is a Visiting Assistant Teaching Professor of English at University of Maryland, Baltimore County. Her research focuses on 13th- to 15th-century literature with cross-cultural contacts and what such literature reveals about law violence, judicial torture and punishment, and social justice. Professor Tracy's work covers German medievalisms, including Nazi appropriations of Arthurian and Old Norse traditions, as well as medieval German texts such as the *Nibelungenlied* and its Norse analogues. Additionally, her research into torture and brutality includes laws of the German principalities and the Holy Roman Empire. She has appeared in several National Geographic and Discovery Channel documentaries, and her work has been published by Salon.com, Business Insider, Elite Daily, *Entertainment Weekly*, *The Wrap*, and *The New York Times* "Women of the World" supplement. Professor Tracy received her PhD in Medieval Literature from Trinity College Dublin. Among the books she's authored are *Torture and Brutality in Medieval Literature*, *Medieval and Early Modern Murder*, and *Wounds and Wound Repair in Medieval Culture*. For The Great Courses, she produced the Audible Original *The Culture of Knighthood in Medieval Romance* and is developing a new Great Course on medieval Christianities.



Dr. James Pfrehm (September 2026, May and September 2027) is an independent scholar who taught German language, literature, and culture at the university level for more than 20 years. He has a deep passion for sharing his love of German and Austrian cultures. In addition to studying and conducting research in Germany and Austria, Professor Pfrehm has led many student tours to both countries. As an associate professor at Ithaca College, he was recognized for his outstanding teaching and commitment to his students. He has a PhD in Germanic Linguistics from the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Professor Pfrehm is the author of the book *Technolinguism: The Mind and the Machine*. For The Great Courses, he has created both The Great Tours: Germany and Austria and Learning German: A Journey through Language and Culture.

- Walk the cobblestoned streets of Rothenburg ob der Tauber, one of Germany's best-preserved medieval towns, and enjoy a tasting of Franconian wines.
- In charming Heidelberg, visit a historic Cistercian monastery renowned for its centuries-old winemaking tradition and explore the grand ruins of Heidelberg Castle.

Itinerary



Day 1: Willkommen in München

Arrive on individual flights into Munich and meet your fellow travelers and Great Courses professor. Begin your journey into southern German culture on an introductory coach tour of Munich, visiting vibrant gardens like Hofgarten and the English Garden, and Marienplatz, home to the city's town halls as well as the iconic glockenspiel whose life-size characters reenact scenes from Munich's history twice a day. Enjoy a guided tour of Nymphenburg Palace, once the main summer residence of the former rulers of Bavaria and the House of Wittelsbach, followed by a welcome dinner at Königlicher Hirschgarten, a classic German beer garden that has been serving pints since 1791.

Day 2: It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad Monarch

Begin with a visit to the legendary Neuschwanstein Castle, built by "Mad" King Ludwig II of Bavaria to serve as both a summer retreat from the constraints of Munich and a tribute to composer Richard Wagner. In the afternoon, visit Hohenschwangau Castle, King Ludwig II's childhood residence, as well as The Museum of the Bavarian Kings, which highlights the history of the House of Wittelsbach. Throughout the day, your professor will discuss Ludwig's unique vision, his patronage of the arts, and the role his mythologized image continues to play in Bavarian identity. Dine this evening at a local restaurant.

Day 3: Bavarian Bovines and Alpine Traditions

In September, travel to the quaint village of Haldenwang to experience an annual event during which decorated cows are driven from mountain pastures to mark the beginning of autumn. This *Viehscheid*, or "cow train," is accompanied by traditional Bavarian music, folk dancing, hearty local dishes like sausages and pretzels, and local revelers celebrating this cherished rural tradition. As you admire the elaborately adorned cattle and take in the stunning alpine scenery, your professor will offer insight into how this festival underscores the deep connection between agrarian life

and regional identity. After a day in the picturesque countryside, enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.

Travelers on the May departures will embark on a full day excursion to Augsburg, one of Germany’s oldest and most architecturally significant cities. Take a panoramic tour of the charming old town, visit the magnificent Augsburg City Hall, and delve into the city’s Baroque splendor with a guided tour of the Schaezler Palace, home to an exceptional collection of European art. Dinner will be at a local restaurant.

Day 4: Imperial Nürnberg

Check out of your hotel and travel via coach to Nuremberg. Explore Nuremberg’s city center on the Bimmelbahn, a comfortable mini train that passes by historic sites such as the Maxbrücke Bridge, St. Lawrence Church, and the Hospital of the Holy Spirit. After lunch in a local restaurant, visit Nuremberg Imperial Castle, a collection of centuries-old, fortified buildings that played a key role in the domestic and imperial affairs of the Holy Roman Empire. Gather at Hausbrauerei Altstadthof for a cellar tour and a tasting of *Rotbier*, a red beer brewed with barley malt.. Check in to your hotel and enjoy dinner and the rest of the evening at leisure.

Day 5: Medieval Charm in Rothenburg ob der Tauber

Enjoy a day trip to Rothenburg ob der Tauber, a “quintessentially German” walled town in the heart of the Franconia region. Learn about the thousand years of history packed between its cobblestones on a guided walking tour of the city’s remarkably well-preserved medieval center. After lunch on your own, visit a winery and enjoy the opportunity to taste local Franconian wine. Return to Nuremberg, where dinner will be in a local restaurant.

Day 6: From Grape to Glass

Check out and depart for the delightful town of Heidelberg and a tour of the 12th century Eberbach Monastery, the former monastic home of the Cistercian monks who have been cultivating vineyards and producing wine since the 1600's. Enjoy a tasting of the monastery's most popular varietals, which may include Riesling, Spätburgunder, and Grauburgunder, and engage in a discussion about the ways in which religious institutions have historically shaped both regional economies and cultural landscapes. After lunch in a local restaurant, the remainder of the day will be yours to enjoy at leisure in Heidelberg.

Day 7: Historic Heidelberg

Begin the day with a walking tour of Heidelberg Altstadt, the historic city center known for its narrow streets, quaint market squares, and gothic churches. Stroll across the iconic Old Bridge, where statues of medieval rulers and philosophers stand watch over the river, and take in the timeless charm of this university town. Explore the grand ruins of Heidelberg Castle, the former home of the Palatine Wittelsbach family that offers sweeping views of the Neckar River below. In the evening, raise a toast to your journey through southern Germany during a farewell dinner cruise along the Neckar River.
