Dr. W. Bernard Carlson is the Joseph L. Vaughan Professor Emeritus of Humanities, Professor Emeritus of Engineering and Society, Program Manager, AgInnovation, University of Galway, Ireland, through the University of Virginia. He is a historian of science and technology, committed to helping public audiences understand the role of technology in society. Professor Carlson received his PhD in the History and Sociology of Science from the University of Pennsylvania. He has received the Sally Hacker Prize from the Society for the History of Technology and the IEEE's Middleton Award in Electrical History. Professor Carlson's biography of Nikola Tesla has been translated into 9 languages. At the University of Virginia he helped create the Committee for the History of Environment and Technology and created both the Engineering Business minor and the Technology Entrepreneurship programs. Professor Carlson teaches the Great Course *Understanding the Inventions that Changed the World*.

Day 1: Welcome to Switzerland

Arrive at Zürich Airport. Meet with fellow passengers and board your first Swiss train for a ride to Zermatt, an Alpine gem famed for its association with the Matterhorn. This mountain town was nearly unknown until the mid-1800s, when adventurous climbers seeking to conquer the peak of the Matterhorn made it a popular destination. Arrive in Zermatt and check in to your hotel. Delve into the history of Swiss mountaineering and railways with insights from your Great Courses expert. Settle into the Hotel National amidst breathtaking mountain vistas. Enjoy a welcome reception and dinner this evening.

Day 2: Glacier Paradise

Board one of Zermatt's iconic red cable cars and ascend to Matterhorn Glacier Paradise, Europe's highest cable car station at 12,740 feet. At the summit, enjoy unparalleled views of Switzerland, France, and Italy, with over a dozen snow-capped peaks towering above 13,000 feet. Continue your journey into Italy for lunch in Cervinia, a scenic ski resort town known for its connection to the Matterhorn's southern face. Then, return by cable car to Zermatt where, in an informal lecture, your expert will explore the highlights and themes of Switzerland's long history. Explore the charming, car-free mountain town on your own this evening.

Day 3: The Peaks of Zermatt

Step aboard the historic Gornergrat Railway, the highest open-air cog railway in Europe, and ascend to one of Switzerland's most spectacular vantage points. This legendary train winds its way up the mountainside, offering panoramic views of the Matterhorn along with 28 other 12,000-foot peaks. At the summit, gaze upon

the Dufourspitze, Switzerland’s highest mountain, and the striking Gorner Glacier, one of the longest in the Alps. Descend to Zermatt for a traditional fondue lunch. Visit the Matterhorn Museum, where exhibits detail the triumphs and tragedies of the first climbers to reach the peak in 1865. Then, enjoy a walking tour of Zermatt’s historic quarter, home to centuries-old wooden buildings perched on stilts, designed to protect grain stores from rodents. Along the way, visit a beloved Swiss chocolatier and sample handcrafted sweets. Enjoy an evening at leisure, perhaps relaxing in one of the town’s cozy taverns for dinner or strolling its atmospheric streets.

Day 4: Grandeur on the Glacier Express

Rise early today to catch one of Switzerland’s most famous trains, the Glacier Express, dubbed the “slowest express train in the world.” This eight-hour journey traverses three cantons—Valais, Uri, and Graubünden—offering a front-row seat to some of the most striking landscapes in the Swiss Alps. Travel through deep gorges, over dramatic viaducts, and past picturesque mountain villages while enjoying a gourmet lunch with fine Swiss wines. Along the route, observe landmarks such as the Landwasser Viaduct and the Rhine Gorge, also known as the “Swiss Grand Canyon.” Disembark at the end of the line in St. Moritz and check into your centrally located hotel. Your evening is your own to enjoy in this glamorous alpine town, a playground for the world’s elite that boasts stunning lake views and a rich history in winter sports.

Day 5: Enchanting Engadine—The Beauty of St. Moritz

Wake up in the heart of the Engadine region, known for its pristine lakes and elegant resorts. Take a ride on the Chantarella Funicular, which connects St. Moritz with the Corviglia summit. Ascend to take



in breathtaking views of the Upper Engadine Valley, where glacial lakes shimmer against a backdrop of snow-capped peaks. Upon returning to St. Moritz, enjoy a group lunch highlighting regional specialties such as Engadine nut cake. Later, visit the Engadine Museum, set in a beautifully preserved early 20th-century house, where exhibits showcase traditional alpine life, from wood-carved furniture to historic farming tools. Learn from your expert about the unique history of mountain railways. Spend the remainder of the day and evening exploring the elegant streets of St. Moritz on your own, perhaps stopping for coffee at a historic café or browsing luxury boutiques.

Day 6: Aboard the Bernina—From Switzerland to Italy

Today, embark on the Bernina Express, a UNESCO-listed railway that takes you from St. Moritz to Tirano, Italy. This spectacular journey traverses the Bernina Pass, reaching 7,400 feet, and descends through a landscape of glaciers, mountain lakes, and charming villages. The train's panoramic windows offer unparalleled views of landmarks such as the spiraling Brusio Viaduct and the dazzling Morteratsch Glacier. Upon arrival in Tirano, board a private coach for a scenic drive along Lake Como, passing elegant villas and colorful villages nestled against the lake's edge. Pause for a leisurely lunch en route and visit the resort of Como before continuing to Lake Maggiore, one of Italy's most enchanting destinations. Arriving in Stresa, settle into your lakeside hotel and enjoy a group dinner and remarks from your expert, savoring local cuisine and the peaceful ambiance of the lake at sunset.

Day 7: Island Idylls—Exploring the Borromean Islands

Begin at Isola Bella, home to the magnificent Palazzo Borromeo—a grand Baroque palace adorned with opulent frescoes, intricate tapestries, and priceless artworks. Wander through the island's terraced gardens, where peacocks roam among rare botanical species. Continue to Isola Madre, the largest of the islands, known for its lush English-style gardens filled with exotic plants and tranquil ponds. In the afternoon, return to Stresa for a wine tasting, a perfect way to toast the region's beauty. Learn more about the region with a lecture from your expert. Then, enjoy an evening at leisure along the waterfront promenade or at a lakeside trattoria.
