

Dr. Robert Greenberg is Music Historian-in-Residence with San Francisco Performances. A graduate of Princeton University, Professor Greenberg holds a PhD in Music Composition from the University of California, Berkeley. He has seen his compositions—which include more than 45 works for a wide variety of instrumental and vocal ensembles—performed all over the world, including New York, San Francisco, Chicago, Los Angeles, England, Ireland, Greece, Italy, and the Netherlands. He has served on the faculties of the University of California, Berkeley; California State University, Hayward; and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and has lectured for some of the most prestigious musical and arts organizations in the United States, including the San Francisco Symphony, the Lincoln Center

for the Performing Arts, the Van Cliburn Foundation, and the Chicago Symphony. For The Great Courses, he has recorded more than 500 lectures on a range of composers and classical music genres. Professor Greenberg is a Steinway Artist. His many other honors include three Nicola de Lorenzo Composition Prizes and a Koussevitzky commission from the Library of Congress. He has been profiled in various major publications, including The Wall Street Journal; Inc. magazine; and the London Times.

Itinerary









Day 1: Welcome to Prague

Arrive on individual flights into Prague (Vaclav Havel Airport: PRG) and transfer independently to your hotel. Set out on an introductory walking tour that showcases the city's rich architectural and cultural heritage with stops at iconic landmarks like the Church of Our Lady before Tyn, St. James Basilica, Prague Astronomical Clock, the historic Jewish Quarter, and the storied Charles Bridge that spans the Vltava River. In the evening, gather with Professor Robert Greenberg and your fellow travelers for a festive welcome dinner at a nearby restaurant.

Day 2: Castle Walls and Concert Halls

Begin your day with a lecture by Professor Greenberg and hear how Prague's complex history intertwined with the city's extraordinary musical legacy. Embark on a guided tour of Prague Castle, the largest ancient castle complex in the world, where centuries of architectural styles and historical layers come together in a dramatic hilltop setting. After lunch, continue to the grand Municipal House, a jewel of Czech Art Nouveau architecture. Here, a private tour will reveal the building's lavish interiors and culminate in a visit to Smetana Hall, one of the country's premier concert venues named for the famed Czech composer. The evening concludes with a performance of the prestigious Prague Spring International Music Festival. Performance details will be announced closer to the departure date.

Day 3: Mostly Mozart

Visit the Lobkowicz Palace, an historic residence within the Prague Castle complex that houses an extraordinary private collection of art, musical manuscripts, and decorative objects belonging to the noble House of Lobkowicz, including original scores annotated by Beethoven and Mozart. After lunch at a local restaurant, attend a classical concert held in the palace's intimate music salon. Then, enjoy a guided tour of the Estates Theatre, one of the oldest European theaters still in use and









where Mozart personally conducted the world premiere of *Don Giovanni* in 1787. Dinner and the rest of the evening will be yours to enjoy in the "city of a hundred spires."

Day 4: Smetana's Prague

Today, your journey continues with a tour of the Rudolfinum, the prestigious home of the Czech Philharmonic. Explore its grand concert halls and behind-the-scenes rehearsal spaces, gaining insight into the heart of the city's musical life. Enjoy lunch at Café Mozart, which overlooks the bustling Old Town Square and the iconic Astronomical Clock. In the afternoon, visit the Bedřich Smetana Museum, housed in a charming riverside building dedicated to the life and legacy of the composer often called the father of Czech music. Next, step into the historic Klementinum, considered one of the most beautiful libraries in Europe for its soaring ceilings, antique globes, and frescoed walls. Then, enjoy a lecture by Professor Greenberg, who will offer a deeper look into the life and works of Smetana and his foundational role in shaping Czech national music. The remainder of the evening will be at your leisure.

Day 5: Mahler's Moravian Roots

Travel to the Czech countryside with a visit to Jihlava, the childhood home of composer Gustav Mahler. Enjoy a guided tour of the House of Gustav Mahler, where exhibits trace his formative years and early influences in this historic Moravian town. The journey continues to the nearby UNESCO World Heritage town of Telč, celebrated for its stunningly preserved Renaissance architecture. Have lunch in the charming main square, framed by pastel-colored facades and arcaded houses, followed by time on your own to wander the cobbled streets. Return to Prague for another remarkable performance of the Prague Spring International Music Festival. Performance details will be announced closer to the departure date.

Day 6: In Dvořák's Footsteps

Begin with a scenic drive to Nelahozeves Castle, a Renaissance treasure overlooking the Vltava River and known for its large art collection and deep ties to the noble Lobkowicz family, longtime patrons of the arts. Along the way, Professor Greenberg will speak about the life and work of Antonin Dvořák, setting the stage for the sites ahead. Just a short distance from the castle, visit the Antonin Dvořák Birth House, a modest village home where the composer was born that provides insight into Dvořák's early life, his humble beginnings, and the rural sounds that later shaped his music. Return to Prague for a special evening chamber concert in the Gothic and intimate Saint-Martin-in-the-Wall Church.

Day 7: Prague's Musical Legacy

Your final day in Prague begins with a visit to the Antonin Dvořák Museum, located in a Baroque villa where a thoughtfully curated collection of manuscripts, letters, and personal artifacts brings the composer's life and legacy vividly to life. Continue to Vyšehrad Cemetery, a place of national reverence and reflection where many of the Czech Republic's most celebrated cultural figures—including Dvořák and Smetana—are laid to rest among striking sculptures and tombstones. Later, enjoy a tour of the recently restored State Opera, an architectural masterpiece that has regained its original Neo-Renaissance splendor after years of careful renovation. In the evening, raise a toast to the unforgettable history and music of Prague during a festive farewell dinner.

Day 8: Departures

Transfer individually to the airport (Vaclav Havel Airport: PRG) and depart Prague on individual flights for your journey home
