Professor Allitt received his PhD in American History from the University of California, Berkeley, and completed postdoctoral fellowships at Harvard Divinity School and Princeton University. He is a widely published author whose books include *A Climate of Crisis: America in the Age of Environmentalism*; *The Conservatives: Ideas and Personalities throughout American History*; and *Religion in America since 1945: A History*. Professor Allitt has created more than 10 Great Courses, including *The Industrial Revolution*; *The American West: History, Myth, and Legacy*; and *The Great Tours: England, Scotland, and Wales*.

Scottish History by Railway Itinerary



Day 1: Arrival in Edinburgh

Arrive in Edinburgh this morning and begin your exploration of the city with a visit to Edinburgh Castle, a medieval fortress that dominates the historic Old Town, followed by a guided tour of the National Gallery. Check into the hotel and gather with fellow travelers and your expert for a welcome dinner.

Day 2: Edinburgh to Inverness

Depart Edinburgh and travel north by private coach, beginning with a stop at the Forth Bridge, an engineering marvel and UNESCO World Heritage Site. Continue to the Falkirk Wheel, a remarkable feat of modern engineering and the world's only rotating boat lift—its elegant, energy-efficient design connects two major canals while showcasing Scotland's innovative spirit. This afternoon, visit the imposing Stirling Castle, one of Scotland's most significant strongholds, famed for its dramatic cliff-top position, Renaissance architecture, and deep ties to figures such as Mary, Queen of Scots and Robert the Bruce. Conclude your day at the National Wallace Monument, honoring Scotland's legendary hero. During the afternoon's bus ride through the Cairngorms, learn about the love-hate history of Anglo-Scottish relations. Arrive in Aviemore and enjoy dinner at the inn.

Day 3: Steam Trains and Speyside Traditions

Enjoy a nostalgic one-way journey on the Strathspey Railway from Aviemore to Broomhill, travelling through the scenic Cairngorms. Afterward, visit a whisky distillery for an insightful tour and a *wee dram*. At the Speyside Cooperage Visitor Centre, discover the traditional craft of coopering—an essential part of Scotland's whisky-making heritage. Back at the hotel this evening, join your expert for a talk on the history of Scottish engineering. The rest of the evening is at leisure.

Day 4: Jacobite Steam and Highland Heritage

Today, travel from Fort William to Mallaig in the first-class carriage on the Jacobite Steam Train, crossing the iconic Glenfinnan Viaduct and taking in the sweeping Highland scenery. Enjoy lunch in a local restaurant before exploring the Glenfinnan Station Museum and viewing the viaduct from ground level. The Chairman of the Friends of the West Highland Lines joins you for a talk on Scottish rail heritage before visiting Neptune’s Staircase, an impressive series of canal locks. Dinner and tonight are spent at a quaint rural local inn.

Day 5: West Highland Rail Journey and Glasgow Icons

After this morning’s lecture on the history of Scottish railways, you’ll board the West Highland Line often described as one of the world’s most scenic rail journeys. From Fort William to Glasgow, you will travel through dramatic Highland landscapes, passing lochs, moorlands, and remote stations that showcase Scotland’s wild beauty. Take an exclusive behind-the-scenes tour of the historic Glasgow Central Station, exploring its hidden tunnels, architecture, and railway heritage. Continue on foot to your hotel for your final nights. Dinner is at leisure this evening.

Day 6: Glasgow Transport Heritage and Farewell Celebration

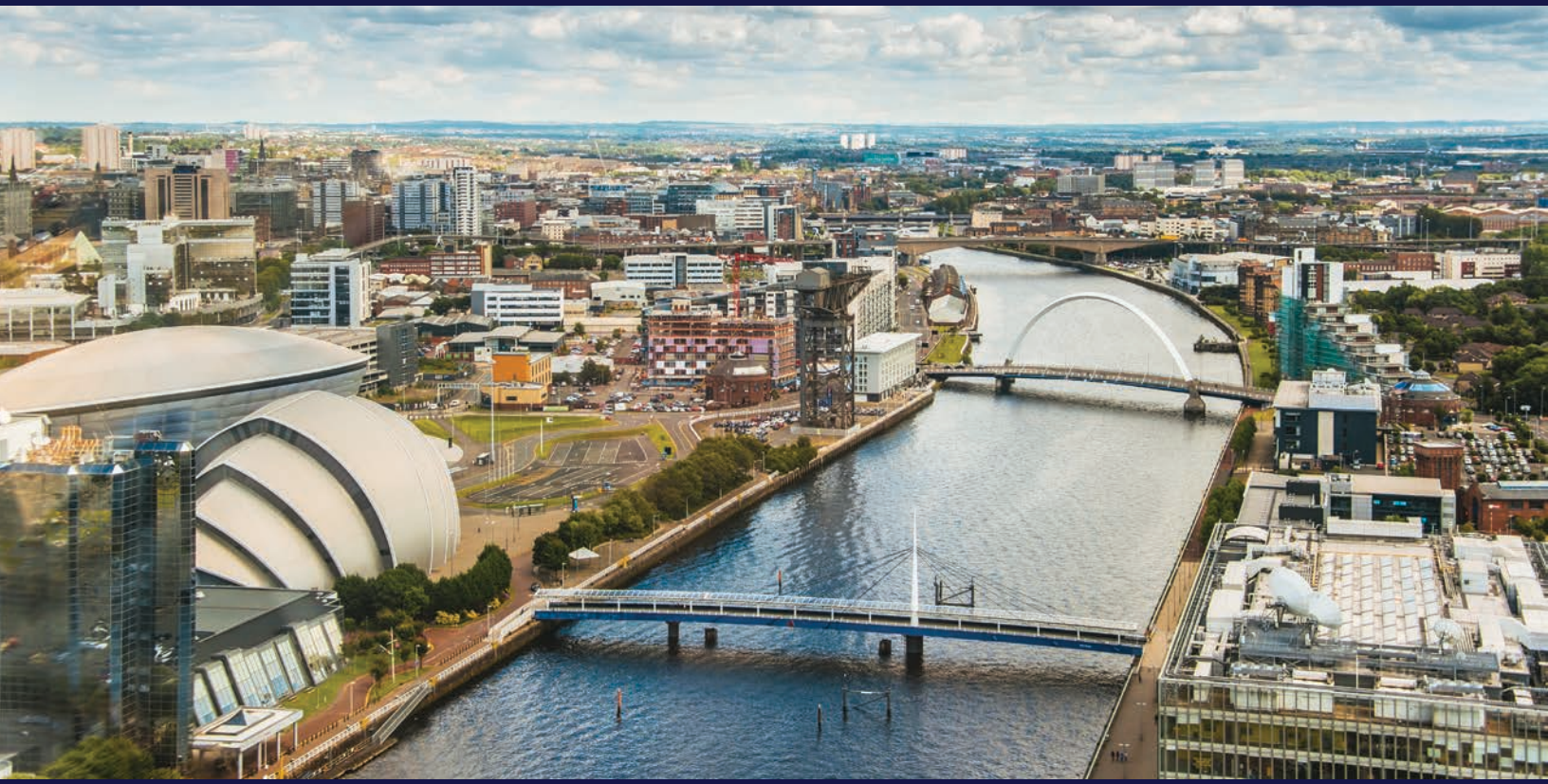

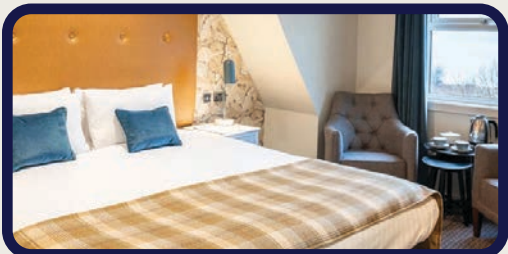
InterContinental, The George | *Edinburgh*
