Dr. Nam Kim (January 2027) is a professor in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is an anthropological archaeologist whose work focuses on Southeast Asia and, since 2005, he has been conducting fieldwork in Vietnam at the Co Loa settlement in the Red River Delta. Professor Kim's research extends to the archaeology of warfare, ancient cities, and the relationship between modern politics, cultural heritage, and the material record. He has been published widely, including books such as *The Origins of Ancient Vietnam*, *The Oxford Handbook of Early Southeast Asia* (coauthor), and *Emergent Warfare in Our Evolutionary Path*. He is currently developing his first Great Course on Vietnam.



Dr. Edward G. Lengel (April 2027) is a professional author, public speaker, and historical tour guide. He received his PhD from the University of Virginia, where he was a full professor and directed the Washington Papers Project for many years. He served as Chief Historian of the White House Historical Association, wrote the new history of Colonial Williamsburg as a Revolutionary in Residence, and worked at the National World War II and Medal of Honor Museums.

Mr. Lengel has written 14 books on American history, including *To Conquer Hell: The Meuse-Argonne, 1918* and *Never in Finer Company: The Men of the Great War's Lost Battalion*. Mr. Lengel is a co-recipient of the *National Humanities Medal* and has won two writing awards from the Army Historical Foundation. He has made frequent television and radio appearances on The History Channel, SiriusXM, National Public Radio, and many other media outlets.

Itinerary



Day 1: Your Vietnamese Voyage Begins

Arrive in Hanoi today and transfer to your hotel overlooking Hoan Kiem Lake. Day 2: City of Citadels, Culture, and Kings

Your day begins with a visit to the National Museum of History, tracing Vietnam's story from prehistory to modern times. Continue to the Thang Long Imperial Citadel, a UNESCO World Heritage site that once housed Vietnam's ancient kings. After lunch, travel to the outskirts of the city to explore the Co Loa Citadel, Vietnam's oldest fortress and a symbol of the nation's early civilization. This evening, explore Hanoi at your own pace, with time to absorb its vibrant street life and historic charm.

Day 3: Contemporary Culture

Start your day with a leisurely walk through Hanoi's iconic Train Street with your expert—where trains pass inches from the adjacent storefronts—to the nearby Kim Lien Market. Visit the Temple of Literature, Vietnam's first university and a symbol of Vietnamese intellectual tradition and culture since its founding in 1070. Gather for lunch at KOTO ("Know One Teach One"), a social enterprise that provides vocational training for disadvantaged youth. Continue to learn about Vietnam's cultural diversity this afternoon with a visit to the Museum of Ethnology, followed by a lecture from your expert. This afternoon, take a guided cyclo tour of the Old Quarter. Later, indulge in a street food tasting where you can sample local favorites like egg coffee, crispy fried nem (spring rolls), steaming bowls of pho, sweet banh ran, and banh mi.

Day 4: Delta Drive and Dynasties

Travel through the scenic Red River Delta to Ninh Binh, passing peaceful villages and lush rice fields. Visit the Dinh and Le Temples, two sacred sites that honor Vietnam’s early kings from the ancient capital of Hoa Lu. Continue to the nearby archaeological site, where remnants of palaces and citadel walls reveal the legacy of Vietnam’s first centralized kingdom. After lunch, enjoy a tranquil boat trip along the Tam Coc River, often called “Halong Bay on land” because dramatic jungle-covered limestone mountains (karsts) rise from flat rice paddies, creating an inland version of Halong Bay’s iconic marine landscape. Glide through scenic caves and beneath dramatic karst cliffs while soaking in the peaceful rhythm of rural life. Spend the evening at leisure in the serene countryside.

Day 5: Stitching Tradition

Your day begins with a lecture from your Great Courses expert about forms of tangible and intangible cultural heritage. Then, visit Van Lam Hamlet, a local village that has preserved the art of embroidery for more than 700 years. Meet skilled artisans in their homes and learn about their craft before trying your hand at stitching. After a group lunch, the afternoon is yours to relax and reflect in the peaceful rural surroundings, with time to enjoy the natural beauty and quiet rhythm of village life.

Day 6: The Beauty of Halong Bay

Take a scenic drive through some of northern Vietnam’s most picturesque landscapes from Ninh Binh to Halong Bay. Then, embark on a luxury overnight chartered cruise through the stunning seascapes of Ha Long and Lan Ha Bays. Explore the Dark and Bright grotto, swim in the bay or pool, and relax on the sundeck. In the evening, enjoy a cooking demonstration with the ship’s chef followed by a gourmet dinner at sunset, surrounded by karst formations.

Day 7: Caves, Culture, and Craftsmanship

Begin the day with an expert-guided sunrise Tai Chi session before exploring the Trung Trang Cave on Cat Ba Island. After breakfast, transfer by speedboat to the pier and visit Dao Thuc Village for a private water puppetry performance. Meet an artisan who helped revive this 300-year-old tradition. Enjoy a private 30-minute performance accompanied by live music, as puppeteers stand in chest-deep water, skillfully bringing wooden figures to life. Then, fly to Da Nang and continue to your boutique hotel in the center of Hoi An, a World Heritage Site known for its lantern-lit streets, preserved merchant houses, and fusion of Asian and European architecture.

Day 8: At Home in Hoi An

Visit a community organic farming project surrounded by lush rice paddies. Learn traditional farming techniques and participate in a hands-on gardening experience. Enjoy a farm-to-table cooking demonstration and lunch. In the afternoon, take a guided walking tour through Hoi An's UNESCO-listed Old Town, wandering past former merchant houses, colorful communal halls, and the iconic Japanese Bridge. Once a prosperous trading port, Hoi An attracted Chinese, Japanese, Dutch, Portuguese, and Spanish ships. Today, the World Heritage city is recognized for its well-preserved architecture, pedestrian streets, and distinctive local cuisine. Visit the Folklore Museum to learn more about the daily life and heritage of the people. Share tea with a passionate guardian of Cham culture in her café and hear about her experiences preserving local traditions.

Day 9: My Son Immersion

Take a short (one-hour) drive to My Son Sanctuary, the ancient capital of the Cham civilization. Explore 20 temple towers nestled in a jungle valley and learn about the rich history of this once-thriving culture that ruled central Vietnam from the 2nd to the 13th centuries. Meet a local wildlife expert to learn about the region's biodiversity and ongoing conservation efforts. After lunch, return to the hotel to continue learning with your expert, who will share additional insights into Vietnam's cultural and historical legacy. The rest of the day is yours to explore Hoi An's charming streets on your own.

Day 10: Discover Da Nang

After breakfast, depart from Hoi An for Central Vietnam's vibrant coastal city, Da Nang. Your visit begins at the Cham Museum, home to the world's largest collection of Cham sculptures. Continue south to the Marble Mountains—said to represent one of the five elements of the universe: water, wood, fire, metal, and earth. Learn about their role during the Vietnam War, when the mountains were transformed from temples to battlegrounds. Continue to Linh Ung Pagoda on the Son Tra Peninsula, featuring an imposing 67-meter Buddha statue and sweeping coastal views. Return to Hoi An this evening for a final reception with your fellow travelers and a farewell dinner featuring contemporary Vietnamese cuisine along the Thu Bon River.




Day 11: Departure
