Sketching Up A Storm

Learning Intentions

Students will:

- Learn the skills to use sketching as a tool to develop and explain ideas.
- Extend themselves beyond their comfort zone, engaging in a design thinking process.
- Develop the confidence in their ability to generate ideas which are a force for crazy good.

Activity Outputs/Outcomes

What does successful learning look like?

- The student will have created a sketch of their idea.
- The student can speak to their idea and the crazy good impact it will make for their select user-group.
- Student's were able to tap into creative flow.

Handy Tips

- Crazy, big, brilliant ideas are more than welcome. In fact, they're strongly encouraged.
- The goal of this activity is not to create a 'pretty picture', it is to bring an idea into being – stick figures are more than sufficient.
- These activities are designed to be fun!
