

Bricolage Wood School — Terms of Enrolment

By enrolling in at Bricolage Wood School (“Bricolage Wood School”, “we”, “our”), you acknowledge that you have read, understood, and agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. Course Structure

The 4 Day Beginners Course is a structured program in which all students build the same designated project. The project has been specifically designed to teach foundational woodworking skills in a safe and progressive format.

Students do not choose their own project. The project design, materials, and scope are determined by Bricolage Wood School.

2. Refunds

All tuition fees are strictly non-refundable. This includes full or partial refunds for non-attendance, change of mind, scheduling conflicts, illness, or any other reason.

3. Eligibility

All participants must be 18 years of age or older at the time of enrolment.

4. Payment Terms

Full payment is required at the time of booking to secure your place.

We do not offer part payments unless explicitly arranged in writing prior to enrolment.

5. Attendance

The 4 Day Beginners Course is designed as a complete program delivered across four consecutive days.

Full attendance is strongly recommended to ensure safe skill progression and project completion.

If you miss any day of the course:

- You may not be able to complete your project

- You may not be permitted to use certain tools if foundational instruction has been missed
- No refunds or partial credits will be issued

Bricolage Wood School does not offer make-up sessions for missed days. Additional instruction, if offered, will incur additional fees.

6. Right of Refusal

Bricolage Wood School reserves the right to refuse entry or participation to any student who:

- Is under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Poses a risk to themselves or others
- Fails to comply with workshop rules or tutor directions
- Behaves in an abusive, threatening, disruptive, or discriminatory manner

Removal from the course under these circumstances will occur without refund.

7. Tutor Authority

Instructors have the final authority regarding:

- Safe operation of tools and machinery
- The size, scope, and execution of the course project
- Material allocation and usage
- Determination of whether a student is competent to use specific equipment

All tutor directions must be followed at all times.

8. Materials

All materials required for the designated course project are provided as part of the course fee unless otherwise stated.

Students may not substitute materials or significantly alter the design without prior written approval.

9. Damage to Equipment

Any student who damages machinery, tools, or equipment due to failure to follow instructions, misuse, negligence, or unsafe conduct may be held financially liable for repair or replacement costs.

10. Project Outcomes

Bricolage Wood School provides instruction, guidance, and supervision. However, individual results will vary.

We do not guarantee:

- Specific aesthetic outcomes
- Perfection of finish
- Completion of the project within the allocated timeframe if instruction is not followed

Project quality depends on individual effort, skill development, and adherence to instruction.

11. Safety and Liability

Woodworking involves the use of hand tools, power tools, and machinery. Participation carries inherent risks.

By enrolling, you acknowledge and agree that:

- You participate at your own risk
- You will follow all safety procedures and directions
- You will use all required personal protective equipment

Failure to comply with safety procedures will result in immediate removal from the course without refund.

Students must disclose any pre-existing medical conditions, injuries, or physical limitations that may affect participation. Failure to disclose relevant information may result in removal from the course.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, Bricolage Wood School and its instructors are not liable for injury, loss, or damage arising from participation in the course.

12. Photography and Promotion

If you do not consent, you must notify Bricolage Wood School in writing prior to the commencement of the course.
