



The Golden Age of Spain

When King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella's marriage united Spain in the 15th century, it set the stage for a great flourishing of art and literature now known as Spain's Golden Age. This Golden Age was fueled by the stunning wealth from the New World that filled the coffers of the powerful King Philip II—money he spent on art to serve religion, and on buildings to reflect his power. Professor Salisbury began her career performing research in Spain, and she has continued to travel there to conduct further research, lecture, and guide students and other travelers.

an undergraduate degree in geology from the University of Plymouth and a Ph.D. in Geological Sciences from the University of Leicester for his studies on Silurian microfossils called chitinozoa. He is a three-time winner of the UBC Earth and Ocean Sciences Teaching Award and is the professor of two popular Wondrium courses: A New History of Life and Introduction to Paleontology.
